

No One Can Server Two Masters

Day 1: Understanding Our Role as Managers

Scripture: Luke 16:1-2

"Jesus told his disciples: 'There was a rich man whose manager was accused of wasting his possessions. So he called him in and asked him, "What is this I hear about you? Give an account of your management, because you cannot be manager any longer.'"

Reflection: In this parable, Jesus introduces us to the concept of stewardship. We are not the owners of our possessions, talents, or even our time; God is. We are merely managers of what He has entrusted to us. Reflect on areas in your life where you may have been acting more like an owner than a manager. How can you shift your mindset to see everything as belonging to God?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, help me to recognize that everything I have is a gift from You. Teach me to be a faithful steward of Your resources. Amen.

Day 2: The Importance of Faithfulness

Scripture: Luke 16:10

"Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much."

Reflection: Jesus emphasizes the importance of being faithful with the little things before we can be entrusted with more. Reflect on your daily responsibilities and how you handle them. Are you faithful in the small tasks? How can you improve your faithfulness in the little things?

Prayer: Lord, help me to be faithful in the small tasks You have given me. May my actions reflect my commitment to You, no matter how insignificant they may seem. Amen.

Day 3: Character Determines Harvest

Scripture: Luke 16:11-12

"So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches? And if you have not been trustworthy with someone else's property, who will give you property of your own?"

Reflection: Our character is revealed in how we handle what we have been given, whether it is our own or someone else's. Reflect on your character and how it influences your actions. Are you trustworthy with what God has given you? How can you cultivate a character that is pleasing to God?

Prayer: Father, shape my character to be more like Christ. Help me to be trustworthy and faithful in all that I do, so that I may honor You with my life. Amen.

Day 4: Serving One Master

Scripture: Luke 16:13

"No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money."

Reflection: Jesus makes it clear that we cannot serve both God and money. Reflect on where your loyalties lie. Are there areas in your life where you are trying to serve two masters? How can you fully commit to serving God alone?

Prayer: Lord, help me to serve You wholeheartedly. Remove any idols from my life that compete for my devotion. May I find my satisfaction and purpose in You alone. Amen.

Day 5: Responding to God's Call

Scripture: Joshua 24:15

"But if serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve... But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

Reflection: Joshua's declaration is a powerful reminder to choose whom we will serve. Reflect on your own life and make a conscious decision to serve the Lord. How can you and your household commit to serving God more faithfully?

Prayer: Heavenly Father, today I choose to serve You. Help me to lead my household in a way that honors You. Give us the strength and commitment to follow You all the days of our lives. Amen.
