# **Group Discussion Guide**

### Ice Breaker

 Question: Share a time when you had to step out of your comfort zone. What was the situation, and how did it turn out?

### **Short Summary of the Sermon**

The sermon focused on the importance of obedience to God's call, even when it leads us into uncomfortable or unfamiliar situations. Rowan shared personal experiences of leaving a comfortable job to follow God's call into ministry, and the blessings that followed from that obedience. Key biblical references included Jesus' call to take up our cross and follow Him (Luke 9:23-24), Moses' reluctance to speak for God (Exodus 4:10-12), and the necessity of baptism for salvation (Acts 2:38). The sermon emphasized that true fulfillment and joy come from loving and serving others as Jesus did.

### **Group Questions**

#### 1. Reflection on Obedience:

How do you relate to the Rowan's initial reluctance to follow God's call? Have you
ever felt unprepared or inadequate for something God was asking you to do?

#### 2. Biblical Examples:

 How does the story of Moses in Exodus 4:10-12 encourage you when you feel inadequate? What does this passage teach us about God's provision?

#### 3. Personal Experience:

Can you share a time when you experienced blessings as a result of obeying God?
 What did you learn from that experience?

#### 4. Understanding Baptism:

 How do you understand the role of baptism in salvation? How does Acts 2:38 and 1 Peter 3:21 shape your view on this?

#### 5. Love in Action:

• The sermon emphasized loving others deeply from the heart (1 Peter 1:22). What are some practical ways you can show this kind of love in your daily life?

## **Life Application**

• **Discussion:** Reflect on areas in your life where you might be resisting God's call due to fear or discomfort. What steps can you take to move towards obedience, trusting that God will equip and guide you?

# Challenge

• **Action:** This week, identify one specific way you can step out of your comfort zone to serve or love someone in your community. Share your plan with the group and pray for each other to have the courage and faith to follow through.
