Day 1: The Widow's Offering

Scripture: Luke 21:1-4

Reflection: Reflect on the widow's offering. She gave out of her poverty, yet Jesus said she gave more than the wealthy. Consider what it means to give sacrificially. What are your "two

copper coins" that you can offer to God?

Prayer: Ask God to help you see the value in what you have to offer, no matter how small it

may seem. Pray for a heart willing to give sacrificially.

Day 2: Equal Sacrifice, Not Equal Gifts

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27

Reflection: God has given each of us different gifts and resources. He doesn't expect us to give equally, but to sacrifice equally. Reflect on the unique gifts God has given you. How can you use them to serve His kingdom?

Prayer: Pray for wisdom to recognize your gifts and the courage to use them for God's glory. Ask God to show you how to make an equal sacrifice in your life.

Day 3: Building the Kingdom Within

Scripture: Luke 17:20-21

Reflection: Jesus said the kingdom of God is within you. Reflect on whether your heart and mind are aligned with God's intentions. Are there areas in your life that need repentance and change?

Prayer: Ask God to help you align your thoughts and actions with His will. Pray for the strength to make changes where necessary to bring His kingdom within you.

Day 4: The Kingdom in Your Home

Scripture: Joshua 24:15

Reflection: Consider how you can bring God's kingdom into your home. Are your

relationships and interactions reflecting God's love and intentions?

Prayer: Pray for your family and home life. Ask God to help you create an environment that

honors Him and reflects His kingdom.

Day 5: The Church's Mission

Scripture: Matthew 28:19-20

Reflection: The church is called to seek and save the lost and to make disciples. Reflect on

your role in this mission. How can you contribute to the church's purpose?

Prayer: Pray for your church and its mission. Ask God to show you how you can be an active

participant in building His kingdom through your church community.

Throughout this week, remember that God values your faithfulness and willingness to give what you have, no matter how small it may seem. Your "two copper coins" can have a significant impact in His kingdom.
